Although both were unavoidably detained Mrs. Card took me around the school and gave me an outline of the planned collective worship: Monday-Clergy, Tuesday-Teachers, Wednesday-singing, Thursday-signing and Friday-celebration.</p> <p>The Christian ethos was evident all over the school. Loved the idea of the hearts scattered around the school for the children to find. The board in the hall showed various Articles from UNCRC urging children to the ‘the best they can be’ and reminding them that each child has this opportunity. I could see the ‘prayer tables’ in each classroom were used. I also liked the idea of children being asked ‘What would Jesus do’ in various situations.</p> <p>Later I met with both Heads and we talked through the curriculum.
