





Faith Parable:

Parable of the Mustard Seed

Jesus Christ teaches that the mustard seed is the least of all seeds, but when planted, it becomes the greatest of all herbs. He compares the seed to the kingdom of heaven- although seemingly very small, it quickly grows and spreads to fill the earth. We liken the growth of the mustard seed, so small, to the growth of our children, having faith in God to grow and develop to become to best they can be.



Faith Miracle of Jesus: Jesus Calms the

Jesus and his disciples went out in a boat. As they crossed the sea Jesus slept.. Suddenly, a storm came and the apostles thought they would die. They rushed to wake him and they asked why he didn't care. Jesus woke and told the storm to be still and the winds stopped immediately. Jesus looked at his disciples and said, "Why are you so afraid? Where is your faith?" The disciples were amazed. They knew that Jesus was very special. Jesus was the only one who could make even a storm obey him. We teach children to have faith in God to support them when their lives get a little stormy.



Faith Core Bible story: Noah's Ark

God was unhappy, because the world

had not turned out how he had hoped, so he decided to send a flood so he could get rid of all the things he did not like, so he could start again. God liked Noah and told him to build an ark and to fill it with two of every animal, his wife and sons to protect them from the flood. Noah had faith in God and did as he was asked. When God send the storm it rained for forty days and forty nights. When the rains stopped, Noah sent out a dove to check for dry land. The dove returned with an olive branch to show that the water had gone down. God promised to never flood the world again, as long as they made the world a really lovely place to live in. God went away leaving a lovely rainbow. We use Noah's ark to teach children to have faith in trust in God.

Love Parable: The Good Samaritan

Jesus tells the story of a Jewish traveller who when walking along the road is beaten up, robbed, and left for dead. A priest comes by, but deliberately avoids the man and does not stop to help. A lawyer also comes by but he too avoids the injured man. Finally, a Samaritan comes along the road, (usually Samaritans and Jews did not get on), but he stopped and helped the injured man, in an act of mercy and compassion. This parable helps to teach children that we should see everyone as our neighbour and that we are equal in God's sight no matter what our culture.



Love Miracle of Jesus: Loaves and Fishes

Jesus was talking to a large crowd of people. The people had been listening to Jesus all day and had not had anything to eat. Everyone was beginning to feel hungry. Jesus felt sorry for all the people and wanted to feed them. A boy in the crowd had brought lunch with him—he had five loaves and two fish in his basket. Jesus asked the crowd to sit down and thanked the boy for being willing to share his lunch. Jesus blessed the food and miraculously the meagre lunch fed the large crowd of people that had gathered to listen to the word of Jesus. This story helps us to teach children that although we may believe that what we can offer is only small, God can turn it into something great.



Love Core Bible story: The Christmas Story

The angel Gabriel visited a young call called Mary and told her that she was going to have a baby. The baby would be God's son and she was to call him Jesus. Mary was engaged to be married to Joseph and he was surprised to hear that Mary would have God's son, but he had faith in God and loved and trusted Mary. When the baby was due to be born, Mary and Joseph had to travel to Bethlehem to be counted. Mary travelled to Bethlehem on a donkey. When they got to Bethlehem there was no room for them to stay in any of the inns. A kind innkeeper looked favourably on Mary and said they could use his stable to rest in. During the night, Jesus was born in the stable and Mary laid him in a manger. Meanwhile, shepherds were tending their flock in a nearby field, when an angel of the Lord appeared and told them about the baby. The angels told the shepherds to go to Bethlehem and worship to new born king. Wise Man were also travelling and they saw a bright new star in the sky, they followed the star which led them to the stable. They worshipped Jesus and gave him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. This story helps us teach children that God so loved the world that he sent his son.

Respect Parable:

The Wedding Banquet

Jesus tells the story about a king who was making plans to hold a great banquet for his son's wedding. He decided to send invitations out to all his friends, family and all the people who were important to him. He made the preparations for a great party and went to great lengths to make it a special event. On the day of the banquet nobody turned up! The king sent his servants to the invited people, but they all declined the offer rather rudely to come to the party stating they were all too busy. Not wanting all of his efforts to go to waste, the king sent his servants out again. He told his servants to go out into the streets and welcome

everybody they came across to come to the party, the poor, the hungry...anybody! The room began to fill up and the party was a success. The people who came were not the king's friends or family, they were not rich or famous, but they came and the king was very happy. They respected the invitation and were welcomed. Jesus tells of how this is like the invitation to heaven. Heaven is open to anyone who wants to come. Respect the invitation - Everyone is invited.

Respect Miracle: Healing the Servant's Ear

When the soldiers and high priests came to arrest Jesus after his friend Judas had betrayed him, one of Jesus' followers, Simon Peter, got very cross. Simon Peter wanted to stop Jesus from being arrested. He knew He was the son of God and wanted to protect his friend. So when Malchus, one of the high priest's servants approached Jesus to make sure he did not run away, Simon Peter picked up his sword and struck Malchus cutting off his right ear! Jesus immediately shouted, 'No more of this!' And touched Malchus' wound, miraculously healing his ear. There was no more injury and no sign that his ear had ever been cut off! Jesus turned and left willingly with the soldiers and high priests. This helps us to understand that we respect all people, we are all valued in God's sight.

Respect Core Bible Story: The Easter Story

Jesus travelled to Jerusalem on a donkey with his friends. Most people were happy to see Jesus, but some priests were jealous. The priests gave money to one of Jesus' friends, Judas, and paid him to betray Jesus and bring him to them. While Jesus was sat having supper with his friends, he looked sad and said that he knew that one of his friends had betrayed him. He broke the bread and shared the wine and told his friends to remember him. Jesus went into the garden to pray and fell asleep. He was awoken by soldiers led by Judas to arrest Jesus. At his trial, Jesus said that he was the son of God and the people were cross. He was taken to Pontius Pilate to be judged. The people shouted that they wanted Jesus to be crucified and to set free a robber in his place. Pilate agreed to crucify Jesus and set the robber free, but he did not agree and washed his hands of sending an innocent man to his death. Jesus was forced to wear a crown of thorns as he carried a heavy wooden cross to be crucified on. He was nailed to the cross and as he died he asked God, hi father, why he had abandoned him. Jesus' body was laid in a tomb by his friends. After two days, Jesus' friend Mary was walking by his tomb and saw that the stone covering the tomb had been rolled away and Jesus' body was no longer there. She saw a man and told him that her Lord's body had been stolen The man was Jesus risen from the dead! Jesus appeared many times to his friends after that, before finally ascending to heaven.

Perseverance Parable: The Lost Sheep

Jesus told the story about a shepherd who had a flock of 100 sheep. The shepherd loved all of his sheep, every single one. Every night he would count his sheep to make sure that all 100 were there and safe. He helped the sheep find the best green grass. He looked for nice clean water so his sheep could have a nice drink when they were thirsty. Sometimes dangerous animals like bears and lions would come and try to hurt his sheep. The shepherd protected the sheep and chased all of the dangerous animals away from them. Then one night, the shepherd was counting his sheep to make sure they were all safe and sound and he only counted 99 sheep. 1 was missing! He counted the sheep again, thinking he may have made a mistake, but there were only 99 sheep. The shepherd could have thought, 'well it's only 1 sheep, I still have 99 safe, ' but he didn't he searched and searched and searched to find the lost sheep. He persevered. Finally, he found the lost sheep and returned to the rest of his flock carrying it on his shoulders. He was so happy that he found his lost sheep. Jesus said the special meaning for this story was that God is like the shepherd. God loves his people.

Perseverance Miracle: The Miraculous Catch of Fish

One day as Jesus was preaching on the shore of the Sea of Galilee, great crowds came to listen to the word of God. Jesus noticed two empty boats at the water's edge that the fishermen had left. He stepped into one of the boats and asked Simon, its owner, to push it out into the water and He sat in the boat and spoke to the crowds from the boat. When he finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Now go out where it is deeper, and let down your nets to catch some fish." "Master," Simon replied, "we worked hard all last night and didn't catch a thing. But if you say so, I'll let the nets down again." And this time their nets were so full of fish they began to tear! A shout for help brought their partners in the other boat, and soon both boats were filled with fish and on the verge of sinking!

Simon realised that Jesus had performed a miracle. Simon Peter continued to have faith in Jesus and never left his side. This story helps us to persevere even when things seem hopeless.

Perseverance Core Bible story: The Creation Story

In the beginning there was no earth or sky or sea or animals. God spoke in the darkness and said "Let there be light!" And then there was light. "That's good!" said God. "From now on, when it's dark it will be 'night' and when it's light, it will be 'day'."

The evening came and the night passed and then the light returned. That was the first day.

On the second day, God made the earth and over it He hung a vast blue sky.

He stood back and admired His creation. "That's good too!" said God and the second day was over.

On the third day God thought the earth needed to be a bit more organized, so He put all the water in one place and all the dry land in another. He made plants to cover the land "It's looking great," said God and that was the end of the third day. On the fourth day, God looked around and thought, "The daylight still needs a bit more work and the night is just too dark." So, He made the sun to light the sky during the day and the moon and stars to add a bit of sparkle to the night. He hung them in the sky and stepped back to look at his work. "This is coming along very well," said God.

On the fifth day, God turned his attention to the water he had collected in the oceans. "I want these waters teeming with life!" As soon as He said it, it was so. In no time, there were millions of small fish darting through the shallow water and huge fish swimming in the ocean. God made birds, too. He sent them soaring through the air. "Ahh, that IS good!" said God. That was the end of the fifth day.

On the sixth day, God added creatures to the land. He made lions and tigers and bears. He made rabbits and sheep and cows. He added everything from ants to zebras to the land. But He still felt something was missing. So God added people to enjoy and take care of it all. God looked around and was happy with all He had made.

After six days, the whole universe was completed. On the seventh day God had a nice long rest and enjoyed looking at all He had made. If you persevere you can make great things!

Forgiveness Parable: The

Prodigal Son

Jesus told the story about a man who had two sons. One day the younger son asked his father for his inheritance money. The father thought and decided to give his two sons their money and he shared it evenly between them.

The younger son immediately left home with his money and planned to never return. He left his home, but more importantly he left his father who loved him and missed him very much. While the son was gone, he spent all of the money quickly until he had nothing left. He didn't have any money to eat and he didn't have anyone to help him. He decided to return home to his father, but he was worried, he felt he did not deserve to be called his son.

As he got nearer to his home, his father came running out yelling 'My son! My son! You are finally home!' The son couldn't believe his father was happy to see him. His father hugged and kissed him. But the son quickly said, "Father, I have sinned against God and against you. I don't deserve to be called your son..." The father said to one of his servants, "Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Bring the biggest calf and kill it. Let's have a party and celebrate because my son was lost and is found!"

When the older son heard of his brother's return and the party held in his honour he was cross. The father heard that he was upset, so he went to talk to him and invited him to join the party. The men were desperate to see Jesus and they didn't know how long he would be in their area. So, when they found he was in a nearby house, they decided to remove the roof of that house to get their paralysed friend to Jesus by lowering him through the roof on the mat! When Jesus saw the lengths that the friends had gone to, to get him to Jesus, He knew that they were true believers and he said, 'Son, your sins are forgiven'. This was not what the man had expected as he had come to Jesus because he wanted to walk. However, Jesus knew what this man needed most because he knew what was in his heart. Jesus knew that being paralysed would be difficult but it was even worse not to be forgiven. The people were surprised because they thought only God could forgive, but Jesus explained that He was the son of God and God had given him the power to forgive sins and heal people. Then, Jesus said to the paralysed man, "I tell you, get up, take your mat and go home." Then the man got up, took his mat and walked out in full view of them all.

One day the brothers pushed Joseph down an empty well and they took his special robe. A little while later some Egyptians came by and the brother decided to sell Joseph to them as a slave! They soaked Joseph's robe in blood and took it to their father and said Joseph had been killed.

Joseph went to be a slave for a man named Potiphar, but quickly Potiphar liked him and made Joseph his helper. The Lord was with Joseph. Unfortunately, Potiphar's wife told a lie about Joseph and Potiphar put Joseph in prison. The Lord was still with Joseph in prison and the warden put Joseph in charge of all the prisoners. He never worried because he knew God was with him. After Joseph had been in jail for some time a cupbearer and baker to Pharaoh had been sent there. One night they each had a dream.
